Hello to everyone,

How wonderful it is to once again see the vigorous sun and the lengthening of the days. Soon, maple syrup time will be a sure confirmation that winter is far behind us.

On the P'tit Bonheur side of things, we have held another "dépannage" activity in February in which over thirty parents came to pick up clothing, knitting, books, toys and other articles for children. I also encouraged parents

to bring their children along with them and gave each little visitor a new book from books that were offered by the Literacy Foundation. I wish to take this opportunity to thank all the volunteers who gave me a very big hand during these very busy yet pleasant days of "dépannage".

I was lucky to have been able to participate in a few training sessions since the holidays and I can't tell you how much these learning occasions, to become a better intervention worker, are precious to me. First of all, a training on the value of fatherhood (the dads!) and the space that is given to them in our services and interventions ,which is becoming bigger, for the happiness of their children.



Next, a really interesting training on literacy development presented by the school board and finally, a pioneering training, that was touching offered by l'Agence de la Santé on Fetal alcohol spectrum disorder, meaning the problems that may result when a baby is exposed to alcohol during pregnancy. In the months to come, I will be working on organising workshops and activities with families of the P'tit Bonheur to transmit this newly acquired knowledge.

Many new families have joined the large family of P'tit Bonheur since the new year and it is always with much respect, openness and pleasure that I welcome them with their strengths, their challenges, their differences and especially with their love for their children. For many, what brings them to contact me is their need for respite, a service offered by volunteers and characterised by home visits in order to care for the newborn to permit the parents to take time for themselves. It's a service that makes a big difference in the day to day lives of these families and which also brings much joy to the volunteers who offer their help. I wish to thank the volunteers who have agreed to live this wonderful adventure reminding them how much these moments are appreciated by the families....A thousand times, thank you ! You feel like offering a few hours to a family? Contact me! The P'tit Bonheur also wishes to thank the parishes of the Mgr. A training session for our accompaniment / transportation Volunteers is in the works. It will be

given in small groups throughout the year. Following the recommendations of the Federation of Volunteer Centers in Quebec and the adoption of the Policy by the Board of Directors, all active volunteers who help with accompaniment / transportation will be asked to come to the CAB and sign a consent form to a criminal background check in order to work with vulnerable persons. A copy of their driving record will also be requested from the Society of Insurance Automobile du Québec (SAAQ). Thank you for your understanding and your cooperation.

LLTTLE FROZEN MEALS...

A Frozen Foods Service - healthy and practical!

The frozen foods service is going extremely well. Due to the plastic films that were used to seal the meals being discontinued by the manufacturer, the Centre d'Action Bénévole has had to purchase a new vacuum sealer. This new machine has a better production level, which helps to reduce the losses that come from vacuum sealing the containers. Furthermore, the new machine allows us to change the size of the seal and therefore offers a much nicer presentation. After changing the



disposition of the food in the new containers, we decided to include mashed potatoes and turnips with the pork fillet and vegetables. Everything looks just as delicious as it tastes!

Last December the Centre applied for a contribution from La Fondation Bon départ de Cana-



dian Tire du Québec (Canadian Tire Jumpstart) for the purchase of specialist material that will respond to the service's needs. The application was accepted and the Centre will receive more than \$1500 worth of kitchen equipment, in response to the 'wish list' that was submitted with the application. The team is delighted by this wonderful news!

Finally, some nicer weather and sunshine to energize us after the gloomy start to the year! Many areas are still covered in ice however, so be careful... a pair of ice cleats would be useful!



Since the beginning of 2016, the Carrefour d'information pour aînés (Senior's information centre) has been offering support to the seniors of our region. The requests for help that the centre has been receiving are mainly in relation to finances, taxes, pensions and the formalities surrounding a death or a separation.

The Carrefour d'information pour aînés is a service offering information on government programs and services for seniors. The service aims to improve seniors quality of life by increasing their understanding of the services available and facilitating their access to them. The information centre relies on the work of our volunteers, who have an excellent knowledge of the paperwork and procedures and who are incredibly discreet, competent and generous with their time. Once again, thank you to each and every one of you.

Recently the CIA volunteers and I held a meeting in order to prepare for the 2016 Tax Clinic, to welcome new members to our team and also to touch base on our 2015 activities.

New for the 2015 tax return: The R-L 31.

The RL-31 slip (available in French only) must be filed by rental property owners that leased a dwelling for which rent was paid during the year 2015. This document is given to the tenant, who must include it in their 2015 tax return. The document is obligatory for applications for Solidarity tax Credit, it will be used to calculate the amount you can claim, if that is the case. It is possible to request and/or provide an R-L 31 even if a lease was not signed. This document is necessary for anyone renting a dwelling, a house, a motel room, a mobile home or any dwelling of this sort.

Attention: Anyone living in low rent housing (HLM), a hotel room, a rooming house, a private residence, an intermediate resource or a long-term care centre (CHSLD) do not have to provide an R-L 31. If you have to provide/receive an R-L 31 and have any questions, you can contact us at 1-855-291-6467 (toll free).
